Memorial Medical Center opened on May 1, 1970. Licensed for 313 acute care beds, the facility is part of Memorial Hospitals Association, a not-for-profit organization that exists to maintain and improve the health status of citizens in the greater Stanislaus County. Memorial affiliated with Sutter Health in 1996 and is accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations.

Patient Services ~

Memorial Medical Center provides and promotes effective inpatient and outpatient health care services, and fosters an integrated system of care in partnership with physicians, other health care providers and payers. The facility provides a full continuum of care including: 24-hour emergency care, surgery, obstetrics, pediatrics, nuclear medicine, open heart surgery, dialysis therapy, diagnostic imaging, outpatient surgery, intensive care, physical therapy and home health.

Improving Facilities and Access ~

The Sutter Health network of physicians and not-for-profit hospitals will invest billions of dollars over ten years to rebuild, replace and expand much of Northern California's health care infrastructure. Locally, plans (or completed projects) include:

- New North Tower, a seven story patient care building featuring 112 inpatient beds and 18 operating rooms

Advancing Patient Safety ~

Memorial Medical Center and our Sutter Health network are raising the bar on patient safety. We are the first network on the West Coast to use early warning software as well as advanced video and electronic monitoring to allow physician specialists to keep an even closer eye on critically ill patients 24 hours a day, seven days a week. We continue to be a pioneer in using bar-coding and expert databases to track medication orders to help prevent errors. To further improve clinical outcomes, enhance patient safety and reduce the cost of high-quality care, Sutter Health also is investing \$450 million to deploy an electronic health record (EHR) system as well as \$1.2 billion in a broad range of patient safety initiatives over the next 10 years.
