Established in 1952 by the citizens of Roseville to ensure health care for future generations, the facility has a long and distinguished record as the area's largest and oldest health care provider. Serving the communities of South Placer and North Sacramento counties, Sutter Roseville Medical Center has 180 licensed beds and the capabilities of providing technologically advanced health care into the 21st century. Housed in a 315,000-square-foot modern facility, Sutter Roseville Medical Center is fully accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations.

Sutter Roseville Medical Center is a designated Level II Trauma Center serving a seven-county region that includes Placer, Yolo, Nevada, Sutter and Yuba counties, and portions of Sacramento and El Dorado counties.

Sutter Roseville Medical Center's comprehensive services include a full array of programs designed to serve a growing community. Services include: a 24-hour Level II Trauma Center and emergency department, Cancer Center, Breast Health Center, Urgent Care Clinic, obstetrics, pediatrics, surgery, respiratory therapy, cardiac and trauma/neuro Intensive Care Units, diagnostic imaging, rehabilitation, cardiopulmonary, outpatient infusion center, occupational health, laboratory, senior services, home health and hospice.

- **Oakmont Health Careers Academy**—Provides high school students exposure to the health-care industry through specific class requirements and on-the-job shadowing and clinical experience at Sutter Roseville Medical Center.
- **Family Support Program**—Links Placer County residents with community support groups and services.

### **Improving Facilities and Access ~**

The Sutter Health network of physicians and not-for-profit hospitals will invest billions of dollars over ten years to rebuild, replace and expand much of Northern California's health care infrastructure. Locally completed projects include:

- Constructed a 90-bed patient care tower
- Added a second Cardiac Catheterization lab with upgraded equipment for both cath labs

Future plans include:

- Expand the Family Birth Center to accommodate growth and relocate the newborn nursery
- Construct a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit of 16 bassinets
- Construct an Acute Rehabilitation Center to provide 40 private beds for acute rehabilitation patients with an additional 16 beds in a shelled space for future use

### **Advancing Patient Safety ~**

Sutter Roseville Medical Center and our Sutter Health network are raising the bar on patient safety. We are the first network on the West Coast to use early warning software as well as advanced video and electronic monitoring to allow physician specialists to keep an even closer eye on critically ill patients 24 hours a day, seven days a week. We continue to be a pioneer in using bar-coding and expert databases to track medication orders to help prevent errors. To further improve clinical outcomes, enhance patient safety and reduce the cost of high-quality care, Sutter Health also is investing \$450 million to deploy an electronic health record (EHR) system as well as \$1.2 billion in a broad range of patient safety initiatives over the next 10 years.
