

## 2023 Brain Injury Rehabilitation Program Outcomes

### Who We Serve

**80** people received **brain injury rehabilitation** at Sutter Rehabilitation Institute in 2023.

The average age of the brain injury patients at Sutter Rehabilitation Institute was 67 years old, with the youngest being 21 and the oldest being 100.<sup>1</sup>

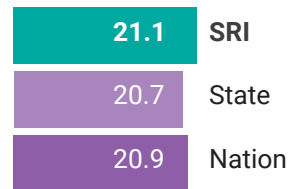
- **16% of patients** were younger than 44.
- **24% of patients** were between the age of 45 and 64.
- **11% of patients** were between the age of 65 and 74.
- **49% of patients** were older than 75.
- **78%** White, not Hispanic
- **3%** Other
- **12%** Asian/Pacific Islander
- **4%** Black, not Hispanic
- **3%** Native American



### Progress Made

Sutter Rehabilitation Institute brain injury patients made significantly greater gains near benchmarks in self-care and mobility compared to patients at other similar rehabilitation facilities in California and the country.<sup>2</sup>

### Returning to the Community

The ability to return home, or to a home-like setting, is the primary goal of inpatient rehabilitation. A high rate of return to the community means that people progress enough to return home and that families and caregivers are trained to provide any needed care.



Sutter Rehabilitation Institute's **rate of return to the community is 85%**, compared to the **national benchmark of 80%**.<sup>1</sup>

### Follow Up

Patients discharged from Sutter Rehabilitation Institute receive a follow-up call to check on their well-being and reintegration into the community. Of the people who responded to the survey last year:<sup>3</sup>



**95%** were living at home or in a home-like setting.

**80%** had **not been hospitalized** since their discharge from Sutter Rehabilitation.



**97%** felt their rehabilitation program improved their quality of life.

### Patient Satisfaction

Our patients express **great satisfaction** with the rehabilitation and care provided at Sutter Rehabilitation Institute.

**97%** of patients responding to the survey were very satisfied with their rehabilitation.

### Readmission to an Acute Hospital

Sometimes a change in a person's medical condition requires an admission to an acute hospital for further medical care. In 2023, **14%** of patients from Sutter Rehabilitation Institute were readmitted to an acute hospital due to a change in medical condition, which is slightly higher than the national benchmark of 11%.<sup>1</sup>
