Who We Serve

people received **brain injury rehabilitation** at Sutter Rehabilitation
Institute in 2021.

The average age of the brain injury patients at Sutter Rehabilitation Institute Institute was 65 years old, with the youngest being 16 and the oldest being 90.1

- 19% of patients were younger than 44. (One adolescent under the age of 18 was treated)
- 19% of patients were between the age of 45 and 64.
- 21% of patients were between the age of 65 and 74.
- **41% of patients** were older than 75.
- **75.3%** White, not Hispanic
- 11.2% Asian
- 6.7% Hispanic
- 5.6% Black, not Hispanic
- 1.1% Native American

Progress Made

Sutter Rehabilitation Institute brain injury patients made similar or greater gains in self-care and mobility compared to patients at other rehabilitation facilities in California and the country.²

Returning to the Community

The ability to return home, or to a home-like setting, is the primary goal of inpatient rehabilitation. A high rate of return to the community means that people progress enough to return home

and that families and caregivers are trained to provide any needed care.

Sutter Rehabilitation Institute's **rate of return to the community is 87.6%**, compared to the **national benchmark of 80.5%.**¹

Patient Satisfaction

Our patients express **great satisfaction** with the rehabilitation and care provided at Sutter Rehabilitation Institute. **92%** of patients responding to the survey were very satisfied with their rehabilitation.

96% of respondents said they would recommend Sutter Rehabilitation Institute to others.

Follow Up

Patients discharged from Sutter Rehabilitation Institute receive a follow-up call to check on their well-being and reintegration into the community. Of the people who responded to the survey last year: 3



89% were living at home or in a home-like setting.

92% had **not been hospitalized** since their discharge from Sutter Rehabilitation.





Their ability to **participate in the community** was rated at **3.1** on a scale from 1 to 4.

(All of these results exceed national benchmarks.)

Readmission to an Acute Hospital

Sometimes a change in a person's medical condition requires an admission to an acute hospital for further medical care. In 2021, **7.9%** of patients from Sutter Rehabilitation Institute were readmitted to an acute hospital due to a change in medical condition, which is well below the the state benchmark of **9.0%** and the national benchmark of **10.7%.**¹
